First day of Sukkot: Begins the evening of Wednesday, October 16, and ends at sunset on Thursday, October 17. October 17 is a non-work day.

The eighth day of **Sukkot/Shemini Atzeret**: Begins the evening of Wednesday, October 23, and ends at sunset on Thursday, October 24. October 24 is a non-work day.

We will communicate additional details in the days ahead and look forward to celebrating these Appointed Times with you.




HELPING HANDS NEEDED


