### Hanukkah

### What Is Hanukkah?

Hanukkah (Chanukah) is the Jewish eight-day, wintertime "festival of lights," celebrated with a nightly menorah lighting, special prayers and fried foods.

Hebrew **Chanukah** The word means "dedication," and is thus named because it celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple (as you'll read below). Also spelled *Hanukkah* (or variations of that spelling).



### When Is Chanukah?

Chanukah begins on the eve of Kislev 25 and continues for eight days. On the civil calendar, it generally coincides with the month of December. Chanukah 2024 runs from Dec. 25-Jan. 2.

## What *Chanukah* or *Hanukkah* Celebrates...

In the second century BCE, the Holy Land was ruled by the Seleucids (Syrian-Greeks), who tried to force the people of Israel to accept Greek culture and beliefs instead of *mitzvah* observance and belief in G-D. Against all odds, a small band of faithful but poorly armed Jews, led by Judah the Maccabee, defeated one of the mightiest armies on earth, drove the Greeks from the land, reclaimed the Holy Temple in Jerusalem and rededicated it to the service of G-D.

When they sought to light the Temple's *Menorah* (the seven-branched candelabrum), they found only a single cruse of olive oil that had escaped contamination by the Greeks. Miraculously, they lit the menorah and the one-day supply of oil lasted for eight days, until new oil could be prepared under conditions of ritual purity.

To commemorate and publicize these miracles, the sages instituted the festival of *Chanukah*.

At the heart of the festival is the nightly *menorah* lighting. The *menorah* holds nine flames, one of which is the *shamash* ("attendant"), which is used to kindle the other eight lights. On the first night, we light just one flame. On the second night, an additional flame is lit. By the eighth night of *Chanukah*, all eight lights are kindled.

On Friday afternoon, care must be taken to light the *menorah* before *Shabbat* candles are lit, and the following evening they are to be kindled only after *Shabbat* has ended.

<u>Special blessings</u> are recited, often to a traditional melody, before the *menorah* is lit, and <u>traditional songs</u> are sung afterward.

A *menorah* is lit in every household (or even by each individual within the household) and placed in a doorway or window. The *menorah* is also lit in synagogues and other public places. In recent years, thousands of jumbo menorahs have cropped up in front of city halls and legislative buildings, and in malls and parks all over the world.

We recite the special *Hallel* prayer daily, and add <u>V'Al HaNissim</u> in our daily prayers and in the Grace After Meals, to offer praise and thanksgiving to G-D for "delivering the strong into the hands of the weak, the many into the hands of the few ... the wicked into the hands of the righteous."

During the season of remembering miracles, we would do well to remember that Our Messiah Yeshua is ultimately the *Menorah* that lights our path to *ABBA*, guides our daily walk and secures our place with Him in the World to Come.

Yeshua is the light and hope for the world and the reason we pledge allegiance to Him.
